Bessie L. (Martin) Robinson September 1, 1885 – July 11, 1966

Died this week in 1966, Bessie L. (Martin) Robinson is buried in our cemetery's Section 5, Lot 22 Space 9.

Summary of our research: Bessie L. (Martin) Robinson was born in Kentucky on September 1, 1885, to James Eli Martin (1856-1935) and Emma Florence (Shields) Martin (1860-1928).

Bessie's father James Eli Martin was born in Kentucky. His father's name is believed to be John Martin.

Bessie's mother Emma Florence (Shields) Martin was born in Kentucky to John Shields and Harriet (Browning) Shields.

Bessie moved with her parents to Rush County in 1903. Her parents are buried at Rushville East Hill Cemetery.

Bessie married Albert N. Morrell (1883-1938) in 1906. They had two children, Raymond Morrell (1907-1947) and Dorothy (Morrell) Noble (1911-1996). Albert is buried in Henry County. Raymond served in World War II with the US Army Signal Corp and was injured. He died from complications of his injury in 1947. Major Raymond Morrell is buried in Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia.

Bessie married John Daniel Robinson (1882-1964) in 1916. John was a machinist. They had two children, James R. Robinson (1918-1995) and Ruth I. (Robinson) Mastin (1925-1999). John is buried at Arlington East Hill Cemetery.

Bessie was a homemaker and member of the Main Street Christian Church. She passed away on July 11, 1966; and was buried next to her husband John in Arlington East Hill Cemetery. She was survived her son, James Robinson; two daughters, Dorothy (Morrell) Noble, and Ruth (Robinson) Mastin; eleven grandchildren; and ten great-grandchildren.

James Robinson also served in World War II as a Private First Class in the US Army. He and his wife are buried in Arlington East Hill Cemetery. Dorothy (Morrell) Noble and Ruth (Robinson) Mastin and their respective spouses are buried in Arlington East Hill Cemetery.
